## Punctuation Rules

1. A statement (declarative sentence) is followed by a period.
  - An ammeter is used to measure electrical current.
2. An abbreviation is followed by a period.
  - Dr. Montoya wants correct punctuation.
3. A question is followed by a question mark.
  - Did you measure the voltage?
4. An exclamation is followed by an exclamation point.
  - Help! I shorted out the voltage source!
5. An imperative sentence may be followed by either a period or an exclamation point, depending on the force intended.
  - Stop drinking my diet Mountain Dew!
  - Do not eat my rice cakes.

\*\*\*\*\* **Commas** (poorly understood and underutilized by engineering students) \*\*\*\*\*

6. Use a comma after an introductory prepositional phrase or phrases.
  - Using a Tenma digital multimeter, the resistance was measured to be 100  $\Omega$ .
